Southern Tasmanian Netball Association (STNA) Junior Statewide Carnival Representative Team Policy

The following Policy has been endorsed by the STNA Board of Management (BOM) and is upheld through the STNA Coaching Committee as governance to the process of representative teams for junior Carnivals. It should be noted that being selected as a STNA Representative is held in high regard and a successful selection process is not awarded lightly, with many missing out.

All players who are successful are to adhere to the below policy in light of this and an understanding that netball is the priority upon successful selection.

- Priority is to the STNA statewide representative team they are selected in to, other sport/s should not be a reason a player is unable to train or participate in any of the carnivals scheduled. Players will be required to sign a statement of understanding regarding the commitment required if the player is selected in a STNA representative team. Parent/guardian to co-sign

Carnival Events

STNA will register representative team/s at the following carnivals:

- NTNA (June)
- Monica McDevitt (July)
- Devon (Sept) Bi-annually or at special request (For review)
- Kingborough (Oct)

1. Selection Timeline

Selections for statewide junior carnivals will be held in April each year.

The Coaching Convenor will advise the STNA office of the date for selections. The date will be advertised through the website, Face Book and Newsletter from the first round of the roster.

2. Selector Pool

The STNA Coaching Committee will organise a selector pool at its February meeting for statewide carnival trials. STNA clubs are to provide up to 2 members for the pool.

On the day of selections, the Coaching Convenor will allocate independent selectors to each age group where possible. Where there is a conflict of interest, the coach will observe from the side then convene with selectors at post selection meeting to support outcome. Age groups may be combined for selections.

3. Coach Appointment

Application for the position of coach will be advertised via the STNA website prior to the selections, with appointments endorsed by the Coaching Committee prior to the selection day.

- Should there not be a coach appointment made for a particular age group then the Coaching Committee shall decide whether selections will go ahead for that age group.



- In the event multiple applications are received for the one age group, a separate sub committee of the Coaching Committee will review each application and a decision made based on:
 - 1. Level of accreditation (Must be Development or higher)
 - 2. Previous experience with representative, development squads or higher level of coaching considered. i.e. tnl/state
 - 3. Consideration to work together as co-coaches or assist.
- A coach may be sourced later if the coaching committee agrees.

4. Player Selections

- Selections will take place on Sundays where possible
- Selections will be run for 11's & 12's between 9am-10am
- Selections will be run for 13's & 14's between 10.30am -12 midday
- Selections will be run for 15's and 17's between 11.30-1.30pm
- Selections will consist of warm up followed by match play of 8-minute segments (This time may vary dependant on numbers)
- Players standing for selection must be current STNA full members
- Players should be given equal time and position choice during match play where possible
- Age groups may be combined as appropriate for match play

Selectors, in consultation with the STNA Coaching Convenor have the discretion to consider players who may not be able to actively participate in trials due to injury/illness or other circumstance, provided prior notice is given in writing direct to the STNA Coaching Convenor. Preference should be given to players attending on the day.

5. Teams

The preferred model is to select two teams of up to 10 players, called Gold and Blue

- Only Gold teams will attend the NTNA and Devon carnivals, however if Blue teams are deemed of equitable standard and the coach/s are prepared to attend then consideration for Blue teams attending these carnivals will be made at the discretion of the Coaching Committee only.
- Players selected in teams must be available for all carnivals (As agreed to by signing commitment form)

6. Player Feedback

Due to the large volume of players attending trials players will not receive feedback as a result. All decisions made regarding selections re final.

7. Notification

All players attending selections will be notified within 3 days of the selections via email

- Public notification will follow with the selected teams posted to the STNA Notice boards and website.



8. Training Guideline

The preferred model requires weekly sessions of 1- 1.5 hrs (a minimum of 4 and maximum of 6) which should be held on Sunday mornings (where possible). Deviation from preferred model should be made through the STNA Coaching Convenor and should be made with consideration being given to player’s club commitments.

8.a Player injury/illness

A player who sustains an injury or has an illness that prevents them from training must provide a Dr Certificate in the first instance, further to this if the injury/illness is ongoing (more than two weeks in nature) then a full clearance is required as ‘Duty of Care’ to the player before resuming training and/or competition.

- Where possible a physio to provide any light training plan/s a player may be able to do whilst recovering, and for the coach to support this as part of the players recovery process.
- Players with minor injuries/illnesses are requested to attend training (Non participation)
- Players with more serious illness/injury are exempt from attending training, however certificate is required. A further review as to whether a substitute player is required will be made based on the seriousness of the injury/illness in consultation with the Coaching Convenor.

9. Uniform

Players selected in STNA Rep Teams are required to wear the STNA uniform. A uniform will be provided to each player.

Non-essential items such as the shorts and warm up tops may be purchased. Where possible a hoodie or similar garment will be provided for all Rep Team players.

- Uniforms MUST to be returned to the STNA office in a clean condition within two weeks of the last carnival and no later than the end of season presentation for rep teams.

10. Fill-in/Replacement Players

- A copy of the registration list of all players trialling is to be retained by the STNA office and the STNA Coaching Convenor.
- Where fill-in/replacement players are required for selected teams, players are firstly to be considered from the original list of players who trialled where possible.
- Request for fill-in/replacement players should be done via direct contact with the STNA Coaching Convenor.
 - Consideration for fill-in/replacement players may be sourced outside of the list i.e. specific playing position needed.

11. End of Carnival Presentations

It is a requirement that coaches, and players remain for the carnival presentations where teams are involved in finals.



12. Post Carnival Presentation event

All Rep team players, coaches, officials and families will be invited to a post carnival season event at the Hobart Netball and Sports Centre (STNA) whereby certificates of participation will be presented.

- This event will occur within a fortnight after the last carnival of the season where possible.

13. Codes of Behaviour

All players, coaches, team managers, officials and supporters are required to uphold the policies of STNA and Netball Australia and all relevant codes of conduct as representatives of the STNA for the duration of all Carnivals.

14. Working with Vulnerable peoples check

All coaches & managers must provide a current copy of their Working with Vulnerable People check registration prior to the first carnival. The STNA Coaching Committee has the discretion to rule regarding any variation from the regulations as set out in this policy.
